

# GRIPS Fellowship and JICA Scholarship

## For GRIPS Current Master Program Students

### An Avenue to Reach Ph.D.

This document is applicable for current GRIPS Master's program students.

1. There is an avenue for students to proceed to the GRIPS Ph.D. program "Policy Analysis Program" with a GRIPS Fellowship or JICA scholarship.\*
2. To be eligible to apply for the GRIPS Fellowship or JICA scholarship, you must do exceptionally well in your academic work.\*\* (See below for the specific requirements)
3. The specific requirements: You must satisfy the following conditions (a), (b), (c) and (d).
  - (a) Complete the following six courses with a GPA over the six courses of 3.7 or higher. (For IDS students the courses can be replaced with the equivalent courses offered by IDS program.\*\*\*)

  - (b) Then, complete the following two courses with grade B or higher.

ECO670E	Advanced Econometrics 1	Spring I
  - (c) Then take the following two courses in the Spring II term.
 

ECO601E	Advanced Microeconomics 2	Spring II
ECO671E	Advanced Econometrics 2	Spring II
  - (d) Your sponsor(s) must agree that you continue your study as a Ph.D. student.

\*The GRIPS Fellowship is available for all students, and the JICA Scholarship is available for IDS students. Both provide a stipend and tuition waiver.

\*\*Needless to say that "one is eligible to apply" does not necessarily mean the person will be given the financial assistance automatically. Rather the fellowships are given on a competitive basis depending on the availability of funds.
