However, long-term care is expensive, and a general public provision will bring a huge financial burden. How to design a provision scheme to balance quality and cost is an important policy issue for aging societies, even for many developing countries, which have been experienced significant improvements in life expectancy and sharp declines in fertility. We also would like to understand the current situation of the support to old people, especially in developing countries, in which public provisions are generally not established. Accomplishment (s) of Project (400 words): Regarding the old-age support in developing countries, we have studied the intra-family transfers between parents and adult children in Vietnam and Indonesia. We found that net transfer flows are almost entirely from children to parents. This observation is in contrast to findings in the US and other developed countries. This may reflects the lack of social security system in developing countries. However, our empirical test rejects that the transfers from children to parents are purely altruistic. Childcre provided by old parents may be one of the factors explaining the transfers.
