1. Choose search tools depending on the type of material



- 2. When you found materials available at GRIPS....
 - a. Use <u>online resources</u>: GRIPS' subscribed e-journals, e-books, open access materials
 - Use <u>GRIPS Collections</u>: books, journals, GRIPS doctoral dissertations/master's theses





- 3. When you found that materials are **NOT** available at GRIPS....
 - a. Obtain books or photocopies from other libraries
 - b. Request a book purchase by the library



3. Use GRIPS' subscribed online resources and search tools

a. Access to online resources and search tools

When you use GRIPS' subscribed online-resources (e-journals, e-books, and online databases) and search tools (GRIPS Discovery Service, E-Journal/E-Book search) from outside the GRIPS (e.g. from overseas),



Access them via Off-campus Access service (EZproxy)

- When you are at GRIPS and use your own PC, connecting via GRIPS campus Wi-Fi, Ezproxy log in is required.
- When you are at GRIPS and use shared PCs, Ezproxy log in is not required. Shared PCs location: Library, Lecture Rooms A & B, Student Lounge, CPC Lounge

b. Off-campus Access Service (EZproxy)

You can use most of the GRIPS' subscribed online-resources and search tools from off-campus, or on campus with your own PC via *EZproxy service*.

How to use

- Log in with your GRIPS ID and password on the EZproxy Login page.
- You will jump to the EZproxy service menu page and you should see "ezproxy.grips.ac.jp" as part of the address field of your Web browser.
- You can use the online-resources and search tools listed there.


You can search or browse <u>GRIPS' subscribed e-journals or e-books</u> by title and access full text versions.






You can search both tile information and full text of many of the GRIPS' subscribed online resources and online open access academic resources all at one time. Some of the search results provide links to full-text versions.



iii. Online databases How to choose a database

GRIPS Library website > Online Resources



- Choose an appropriate database according to what you want to search for
 - Field: multiple field, natural/social science, humanities, etc.
 - Material types: Journal articles, news, documents, statistics, etc.
 - Coverage
- Some databases provide full-text links
 - e.g. EBSCOhost (Academic Search Premier)
- How to access: Available on campus, in-library use only, open access

Q1. There's a maximum 100 page limit for printing/saving e-book "The Age of Sustainable Development." Is this applicable to each e-book or each person's account?

A1. Each e-book. When you use another one, there's another limit. Number of pages (print/save) depends on the publishers.
