

Young Leaders Program

Purpose of the Program

This program aims to contribute to the development of national leaders in Asia and other countries around the world, to create human networks among such leaders, to build friendly relations between Japan and these countries, and to improve the policy-making functions of these respective countries.

Diploma Policy

This program confers Master of Public Policy on students who have enrolled for at least one year, have acquired the required number of credits based on the curriculum of the program, and by receiving necessary research guidance under the supervision of Faculty Members have written and given a presentation of a Master's thesis or a research paper on specific policy issues, and have obtained an overall pass for his or her studies.

In this program, students should acquire the following qualities and abilities:

1. Ability to play an active role as a national leader in Asia and other countries around the world
2. Ability to acquire extensive knowledge on public policy that is necessary to generate effective solutions to policy problems
3. Ability to build a strong foundation of relationship with Japan based on a deep understanding of Japan
4. Ability to analyze specific policy issues, formulate policy recommendations on them, and present them appropriately

Curriculum Policy

【Basic Policy】

This program provides various courses for students to gain a broad knowledge on public policy with an interdisciplinary perspective. In addition, the curriculum focuses on discussions with lecturers and/or among students, as well as incorporates field trips to the front line of public administration, in order

for the students to acquire the ability to exercise leadership in the resolution of policy issues and the management of government organizations. Furthermore, the program trains leading policy professionals in Asia and other countries around the world by requiring students to write a Master's thesis or a policy paper that is a practical policy recommendation on specific issues.

【Structure of the Curriculum】

The curriculum of this program is 12 months long, and students plan their courses for the year through the program guidance they receive when they first enroll.

The curriculum consists of required courses to develop necessary abilities as leaders, to extend analytical capacities, and to deepen understanding of Japan; recommended courses to learn the subjects of basic and important fields related to public policy; elective courses to learn a wide range of fields related to public policy. Students must also study and analyze specific policy issues and compile and present a research paper as policy recommendations.

(Required Courses)

Required courses consist of (1) courses to improve leadership, (2) courses to acquire basic knowledge about public policy including courses for the School of Local Governance that teach knowledge specific to local administration, (3) courses to deepen understanding of Japan, and (4) courses to analyze and consider specific policy issues deeply and compile practical policy recommendations.

As one of the courses in (4), "Independent Study" is offered in a seminar style in which students can acquire in-depth knowledge in the target field of their research and develop practical problem-solving and logical thinking skills in preparation for writing a Master's thesis or compiling the results of research on selected specific policy issues.

(Elective Courses)

Elective courses include (1) courses in basic and important fields related to public policy, such as the basics of economics, the structure of government, international relations, and Japan's economic development, as recommended courses, and (2) courses on a wide range of fields related to public policy, as well as courses to enhance academic writing skills in English for writing papers, as elective subjects.

(Research Guidance)

In the individual guidance of students, research guidance is provided by a multiple number of main supervisors and sub-supervisors.

【Policies on Education and Study Methods】

Of the 30 credits required to complete this program, at least 10 credits are in seminar-style. Through discussions with lecturers, senior officials of government and local governments, and among students themselves as well, students will develop their abilities as leaders. In addition, lectures are not just one-way passive listening. Students will make presentations and join in discussions, making lectures interactive.

【Assessment Policy】

To assess the academic achievement in each course, students are evaluated based on acquisition and understanding of policy-related knowledge and practical skills, taking into consideration their contribution to the class, examination, term papers, report submission, etc., and their ability is also evaluated through the writing of a Master's thesis or a research paper on a specific policy issue.

Admissions Policy

Target Students

We will accept administrative officers with the potential to play an active role as national leaders in Asia and other countries around the world.

For admission, students must have at least 3 years of experience working in the public sector (more than 5 years is desirable) and have English skills necessary to take lectures and to write a Master's thesis or a policy paper.

Screening methods and standards

Application documents and interviews are used for screening. Successful candidates are determined based on a comprehensive evaluation of their intellectual ability on public policy issues, English ability, work performance, evaluation of the recommender, and future potential as a policy leader.
